New Website	
Design	Completed – Commissioners provided feedback in September 2021 on possible design layout and features based on contractor's available templates, and reviewed feedback from internal and external stakeholder surveys including FlashVote.
Implementation	Completed – Commissioners was scheduled to review draft of the new City website but due to a staff emergency, the June meeting was cancelled. The City website officially launched July 1, 2022.
Solid Waste and Recyclin	<u>ng</u>
Annual Rate Review and Expansion of Bulky Item Service to the Multi- Family Sector	Completed – Commissioners reviewed Burrtec's rate case for the solid waste and recycling rates for 2022 including expanding automatic bulky item pick-up to the multi-family sector in an effort to mitigate illegal dumping. The Commission made the recommendation to the City Council to accept Burrtec's rates that included expansion to the bulky item pick-up program.
SB 1383 Residential Food Waste Program	Implemented – Commissioners received two presentations on SB 1383, one as a part of the 2022 rate review and one specific to the residential food waste program component of the legislation. Food waste program rolled out on September 1, 2022.
SB 1383 San Gabriel Valley Regional Food Recovery Program	In Progress – Commissioners received two presentations on SB 1383, one as a part of the 2022 rate review and one specific to the food recovery component of the legislation. Duarte is a participating in the San Gabriel Valley Regional Food Recovery Program. Phase one of the program which included capacity assessment, education and outreach to businesses that are required to participate under the law, and initial inspection of said businesses completed in June 2022. Phase two will begin in fall 2022 which will include capacity and infrastructure expansion, in addition to further education, outreach and inspections.
2023 Rate Review	Anticipated Work – Commissioners should be receiving a presentation about the 2023 Burrtec rates within the next two months.
