FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact in making a recommendation.

BACKGROUND

At the request of staff, Burrtec has included in their 2022 rate analysis an option to expand bulky service to the multi-family residential sector. Currently, illegal dumping of items in front of multi-housing units is primarily picked up the City's Field Services staff, a time-consuming use of staff resources, and on occasion by Burrtec at their expense if City staff makes the request for assistance.

Under the City's Franchise Agreement with Burrtec, residential customers can receive twice per year bulky item pickup at no extra charge, but the options for commercial customers are available at an additional charge. Commercial and multi-family subscribers can rent a large bin for the purpose of collecting bulky items or contact Burrtec for bulky item pick at an additional fee. Multi-housing unit dwellers can also bring their bulky items to the two free Community Clean-Up events hosted by the City and Burrtec, or self-haul these items to the local transfer station in Azusa or Whittier. Out of 52 Multi-family Burrtec accounts in Duarte, 22 account-holders requested bulky item pick-up 1-5 times, five accounts requested 4-6 times, and five accounts requested more than seven times. Twenty accounts did not make any requests in 2021.

Expansion of the bulky item pick-up program would allow multi-family unit residents to place unwanted bulky items next to the bin or bin enclosure without making an appointment, and the items would be collected on the regular trash collection day or during that service week by a recycling vehicle.

COMMERCIAL RATE ANALYSIS

Components included in the rate calculation consist of the below stated disposal rates, the CPI

change as measured by the annual average for all urban CPI in Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim as released in 2021 of 3.93 percent; and the change in the average price per gallon of fuel based on the US Department of Energy Alternative Fuel Pricing Report, which decreased by 2.39 percent. It should be noted that, although the trash disposal and green waste processing cost components increased in September, customers did not see that increase in their monthly bills. The increased cost for the months of September through December 2021 will be spread out over twelve months in the 2022 rates.

Additionally, after years of increased recycling costs due to the closure of certain recycling markets, the 2022 rates reflect some stabilization in those markets which has resulted in a decrease in the recycling cost component.

California State Assembly Bill 341 and Assembly Bill 1826 require the compliance of businesses and multi-family residential dwellings in mandatory commercial solid waste and organics recycling. When AB 1826 was enacted in 2014 requiring commercial organics recycling for businesses that generated eight cubic yards or more of organic waste per week (that threshold has since decreased to two cubic yards of solid waste generation), Burrtec and City staff worked together to assist businesses in sharing the cost of food waste processing. Burrtec's proposed commercial rates are below using the current model of equalizing the food waste processing cost across all commercial customers including multi-family housing properties.

If the City Council were to adopt an expanded bulky service to the multi-family residential sector, the rate structure would change as follows:

• All commercial accounts except for multi-family accounts would be offered a solid waste

- rate equalized with the food waste processing cost to, again, assist those businesses in cost sharing and mitigate high financial impacts. Removing multi-family accounts, though, would lessen the number of those businesses cost-sharing which would result in a \$14.99 increase per month for a single three-yard bin picked up one time a week for trash services.
- Multi-family accounts would be offered a solid waste rate with the bulky item pick up program cost component that includes fifteen hours of bulky item collection and disposal services activity. This would result in a \$16.37 increase per month for a single three-yard bin picked up one time a week for trash services. Bulky items could be disposed of at any time alongside regular trash services.
