## Sign-In/Sign-Out Procedures

For the safety of all campers, parents/guardians or an authorized adult are required to walk participants into and out of the park building daily for camp sign in/out. Parents/guardians or authorized adults should be prepared to show I.D. upon request. In addition, review with your child who is allowed to pick them up.

Participants will be allowed to sign themselves in and out of the program if they have been granted written permission (by Parent/Guardian), otherwise, an authorized adult must sign them in and out. Please return the Walk/Bike Release Form if your child is allowed to walk/bicycle to and from camp.

### First Aid/CPR

In addition to having a fully stocked first aid kit onsite at all times, our day camp leaders are a group of responsible and dynamic individuals who are trained and certified by the American Heart Association in Child CPR and First Aid.

# **Emergency Procedures**

On the first day of each session, camp leaders will conduct a practice evacuation drill. In the event of an emergency requiring an evacuation, all children will be transported as soon as possible to Duarte City Hall, 1600 Huntington Drive, where parents/guardians will be contacted for pick up as soon as all campers are safe.

# **Medication & Allergies**

For those campers requiring administration of medication, every effort should be made by the parent/guardian to administer those prior to or after camp hours. However, should prescribed medication absolutely need to be administered during camp hours, please see camp staff on your first day to acquire and complete our Permission to Administer Medication Form.



### **Camp Behavior**

#### **Rules and Consequences:**

Please assist the staff by reviewing with your camp participant(s) the rules listed below:

- All staff and participants will be treated with respect.
- Absolutely NO fighting, biting, hitting, kicking, or violent behavior.
- NO playing in the restrooms. Restrooms are to be kept clean.
- Throwing rocks, sticks, mud clots, dirt, sand, or foreign objects is not permitted.
- Inappropriate language will not be permitted.
- Bullying will not be tolerated.
- Participants cannot leave the Camp site without permission.
- Use of personal phones and other electronic devices are only permitted with staff permission.
- Toys (pokemon cards, dolls, stuffed animals, etc.) are not allowed at camp.
- Participants must follow directions at all times.

Staff will provide and maintain clear, reasonable limits for participants behavior.

Positive behaviors will be reinforced and negative behaviors identified and redirected. If a participant(s) behavior at any time threatens the immediate safety of himself/herself, other campers, or staff, the parent/guardian will be notified and expected to pick up the participant immediately.

If a parents/guardians are not available, staff will contact individuals listed on the emergency form. Failure to comply with Camp Policies may result in suspension or removal from the program. There will be no refunds provided for participants who are removed from the program due to violations of Camp Rules and Policies. Credits for payments will be given at the discretion of the Program Coordinator.

# What Should My Child Bring to Camp?

- Campers must bring a sack lunch for session 1 & 10.
- Feel free to pack extra snacks.
- A reusable water bottle, labeled.
- Campers should wear athletic shoes, clothes they can be active in, and a jacket.
- Splash Camp participants should bring a towel, swim suit, and a change of clothing on swim days.

If your child has any special dietary needs/allergies not listed during registration, please inform staff upon arriving your first morning at camp or you may also email George Dang, Recreation Supervisor, at gdang@accessduarte.com.



# **Electronic Device Policy**

Although electronics are strongly encouraged to be left at home, their use is only allowed at camp with staff permission oHowever, your child will be responsible for their belongings at all times. The City of Duarte is not responsible for any lost, broken, or stolen items. If parents/guardians consent to their child bringing personal electronics to camp, they should be put away and only be used with the approval of a camp leader or for emergency purposes. Wi-Fi is not available for participants at camp.

### **Lunch and Snack**

Lunch will be served daily and will be provided by the Duarte Unified School District Food Services Department. You are welcome to send your child(ren) with their own lunch or supplement the lunch provided with additional food and snacks. For session 1 and 10, Campers must come daily with a sack lunch.

# Weekly Feature Activity and Swim Days

On Wednesdays, campers at the Summer Day Camp location (Royal Oaks Park) will enjoy a special on-site activity. Campers enrolled for Duarte Splash Camp location (Duarte Park) will take a walking trip to the Duarte pool on Tuesdays & Thursdays. (Session 1 swim days are Wednesday & Friday).

## If Campers Become III While at Camp

- We have secured an area for any campers who become ill.
- The camper who is ill will remain in this area until they can be transported home or to a healthcare facility, as soon as practical.
- Sick campers may not return until they are no longer exhibiting symptoms.
- Refunds and/or credits will be accessed individually.
