

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR

Definition:

Under the general direction of the Recreation Superintendent, supervises the custodial team and is responsible for maintaining City facilities, and appropriate equipment, in a state of repair or operating condition that meets or exceeds established standards of safety and efficiency.

Essential Job Duties:

The following tasks are essential for this position. Incumbents in this classification may not perform all of these tasks, or may perform similar related tasks not listed here.

- 1. Coordinates the maintenance of City buildings, swimming pool and pool equipment, sports infields, drinking fountains, park playground equipment, and related facilities and/or equipment.
- 2. Schedules, organizes, and inspects the work of facility maintenance services performed by staff and contract personnel.
- 3. Maintains and purchases custodial supplies, equipment, and related inventory.
- 4. Recruits, supervises, and evaluates Facilities Maintenance staff.
- 5. Coordinates training for maintenance staff related to a variety of skilled trades work.
- 6. Ensures that the City is in compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal laws.
- 7. Ensures maintenance staffing for activities at City facilities, according to department and City policy.
- 8. Participates in whatever maintenance duties are necessary to achieve departmental goals.
- 9. Maintains tools in proper condition for safe, efficient use at any time by all members of the maintenance staff.
- 10. Processes all requests for services.
- 11. Maintains and ensures that an annual inspection and repair schedule of all facilities is adhered to.
- 12. Performs other related duties as required.

Minimum Knowledge, Skill and Ability:

Knowledge of:

- Methods, equipment, tools and materials used to perform maintenance work.
- Operation of a variety of hand and power tools and equipment.
- Appropriate safety precautions and procedures.
- Basic maintenance trades.
- Principles of training, performance appraisal and budgeting.
- Principles of organization, management, and personnel supervision.
- Record keeping and reporting procedures.

Skill and Ability to:

Perform heavy labor.

- Work evenings, weekends, and/or holidays.
- Perform skilled trades work.
- Understand and follow oral and written direction.
- Use and operate various tools, equipment and vehicles.
- Work well with others.
- Work independently, without direct supervision.
- Achieve results through work planning, implementation and follow-up.
- Create and implement new concepts in programs and activities.
- Supervise, evaluate, and train subordinates.

Training and Experience:

Any equivalent combination of training and experience that provides the required knowledge, skills, and abilities could be considered qualifying. A typical way to obtain the knowledge, skills, and abilities would be graduation from high school and six years of experience in building/construction trades and journeyman experience in at least one trade, including two years of supervisory experience. Previous experience working with large swimming pool equipment systems is preferred.

Licenses and Certificates:

Possession of a valid California driver's license, current First Aid and CPR certification, and live-scan fingerprinting clearance required; current Playground Safety Inspector and Public Pool Operator certifications are desirable.

Physical Requirements and Working Conditions:

- Requires vision (which may be corrected) to read small print.
- Requires the mobility to stand, stoop, reach and bend.
- Requires mobility of arms to reach and dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate small objects.
- Requires the ability to stand for long periods.
- Requires the ability to walk long distances.
- Performs work which involves the frequent lifting, pushing and/or pulling of objects which may approximate 75 pounds and may occasionally weigh up to 100 pounds.
- Subject to inside and outside environmental conditions.
- May be required to traverse hilly and rocky terrain.
- May be required to use personal vehicle in the course of employment.
- May be required to work evenings, weekends, and holidays.
